Using the registration data from the Statewide Database at UC Berkeley, we can compare partisan registration by county for Total, Latino Surname Registration, and Non-Latino, Non-Asian Surname Registration as a proxy for non-minority registration trends. Looking at Counties in the Inland Empire, Central Valley, and north Central Coast, registration rates for Latinos are decidedly more Democratic than Republican, and the Non-Latino, Non-Asian population is decidedly more Republican than Democratic, implying differences in registration and voting habits.
