

Proposed Changes to Congressional District WLADT

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Definition of Congressional District WLADT

The communities in the district are similar in the following ways:

- Coastal or hilly communities or communities that border a coastal or hilly community
- Generally affluent communities
- Based in Los Angeles County
- Includes the Los Angeles County communities adjacent to the Santa Monica Bay
- Includes the Los Angeles communities and land making up the Santa Monica Mountains



Proposed Changes to Existing Congressional District WLADT

I propose that adjustments be made to the most current draft of boundaries for the district (dated 7/18/11) to address the following issues:

- City of Beverly Hills is split between two districts
- Strip of Mid-City Los Angeles not social-economically similar to district (should be in IGWSF or SGMFH or ELABH district)
- The community of Playa Vista is coastal and affluent
- The community Playa Del Rey is coastal and affluent and not completely in the district
- The community of Lomita is more social-economically linked to the rest of the South Bay (should be in ISWG or COMP districts)
- The community of Harbor City is more social-economically similar to the rest of the South Bay (should be in IGWSG or COMP district)
- The community of San Pedro is more social-economically similar to the rest of the South Bay and parts within the district (should be in COMP district)
- Southwestern Torrance is more social-economically similar to the affluent beach communities of the South Bay
- The community of Hollywood Hills is an affluent hill community which could be added to the district
- The City of Westlake Village is a part of Los Angeles County and should be part of the district
- The City of Calabasas is an affluent hill community which could be added to the district
- The City of Hidden Hills is an affluent hill community which could be added to the district






Maps of New Proposed Congressional District WLADT





Detailed Maps of New Proposed Congressional District WLADT

Analysis of Proposed Changed District to Original District

The Ethnicity/Race breakdown is not significantly different from the original district. There is a slight increase in the percentage of Whites in the new district and a correspondingly slight decrease in Blacks and Asians, however the district was already predominately White before the proposed changes. Hispanic representation drops almost 2% (or only 1% for voting age Hispanics), however it can be concluded that representation for Hispanics should be increased correspondingly in neighboring districts.
